## Local food shelves report increased use

The wind chill was five degrees below zero at 8:30 a.m. Wednesday as the line for food began to form outside the Disciples Ministry Church Mission.

The mission opened at 10 a.m. and the line grew longer, stretching around the corner and continuing nearly two blocks.

About 5,000 bags of groceries were

handed out in four hours yesterday, and the church, at 1000 Oliver Av. N., had to turn away some people who arrived too late, said Jeanine Durand, who works at the mission.

State and local officials say that requests for food by the poor this holiday season are up over last December,

"Last year we helped nearly 20,000 people over the holidays," said
